




NO WEEKLY SPELLING LISTS!

Scientific Spelling will be used as a guide for teaching spelling. Grade level curriculum road map will be used to decide the new pattern or rule for the week.

What is Scientific Spelling?

- Curriculum to teach spelling by using reliable patterns and rules of the English language
- Students learn by analyzing words
- Aids the retention of words and reinforces basic spelling information.
- No memorization of lists
- Lessons are by grade level




- Morning work is completed each day in your child's homeroom, so it is important your child is on time

Homework



- Homework is a campus wide expectation this year. Homework is a criteria on student's behavior conduct card.

- Homework will begin August 26th.




- Dreambox is a math learning environment that adapts to your student's needs.
- Students see practice units and lessons depending on how they perform on assessments.
- Dreambox heavily incorporates manipulatives.
- Since Dreambox is adaptive, teachers have little control over what unit students are working on.
- Dreambox decides what skills your student needs to practice and when they are ready for new lessons.
- FOR STUDENTS TO MAKE PROGRESS

 STUDENTS COMPLETE 5 LESSONS PER WEEK.

- Reading Plus provides foundational reading skills and adjusts
 to students' needs as they complete lessons.
- Students see practice units and lessons depending on how they perform on assessments.
- FOR STUDENTS TO MAKE PROGRESS
 IT IS RECOMMENDED THAT
 STUDENTS COMPLETE 5 or more
 LESSONS PER WEEK.

HOW TO ACCESS

To access Dreambox on an iPad, download the Classlink app and the Dreambox app. Login the Classlink app. Find the Dreambox icon.

It will prompt you to launch the app.
The program will automatically open in the app.

Up to 5 Parent letters will be accepted for excused absences. Absences after 5 will be marked as unexcused, unless a Doctor's note is presented.

The Texas attendance policy states that a student must be in a class at least 90% of the time if they want to be sure to get credit for that class.

If students miss 18 or more school days, it can prevent them from promoting to the next grade level.


ATTENDANCE: TARDY POLICY
