

Be in School Every Day

The importance of regular attendance cannot be overemphasized.



When you miss school, you miss lectures, notes, class discussions, homework explanations, assignments, quizzes, and tests. It doesn't matter how conscientious you are about making up work, you can never make up everything you miss, even when you're out for only one day. In order to get good grades, you need to be in school every day.

If you must be absent from school, remember that you are responsible for finding out what you missed and for getting all of the work made up. When absent, you can email your teachers to find out what assignments you are missing. If you miss any quizzes, tests, or presentations, you are, of course, also responsible for arranging to get these made up. Students can make up tests before or after school with their teacher or in Ranger Success Center in the library after school.

Since teachers usually do not have time to talk to you during class, see each teacher before or after class and ask when he/she might have time to talk to you. Once you find out what you need to do, get everything made up as soon as possible.

By state law, students who miss more than 9 absences can lose credit in the course. Students can make up clock hours by attending Saturday school. Students need to talk to their assistant principal to determine if they need to attend clock hours to make up absences.
